#### HOPE IN HARD TIMES

"I pray that God, the source of hope, will fill you completely with joy and peace because you trust in Him. Then you will overflow with confident hope through the power of the Holy Spirit." ~ Romans 15:13 (NLT)

I don't know about all of you, but sometimes I feel like hope is lost. Hope for our country to turn back to God and enjoy His blessings being poured out on us. Hope that our community will experience revival and see the darkness pushed back by the light of Jesus. Hope that people really can submit to Jesus and be changed. Hope that all the things I've invested my life in will not prove to be worthless.

It's in those moments that I have to preach truth to myself as the psalmist did in Psalm 42 saying, "Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad? I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again—my Savior and my God!"

Repeating the truth that God is our hope, even when things are looking really hopeless, may not change the way we feel, but it can change the way we think about the situation. Our spiritual battles are won or lost in our minds, so it's important that we capture our rebellious thoughts and teach them to obey Christ (2 Corinthians 10:5.) When we win the battle in our thoughts, we can begin to experience God's joy and peace, and that is what Peter says will cause us to overflow with hope.

Dear friends, if hope seems far away today, <u>Lencourage you to take your hopeless</u> <u>thoughts captive and remind yourself that Jesus is our living hope.</u> He suffered but then He was raised to live forever! And, like Him, our suffering will be momentary. But our hope is eternal!


