Galatians 5:1 – “Stand fast therefore in the liberty by which Christ has made us free...”

Galatians 5:13 - “For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.”

Galatians 5:16 – “I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.”

- II. Definition of Freedom:
  - a. World Definition: The dictionary definition according to Google is, “the power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants without hindrance or restraint.”
  - b. Biblical Definition: Freedom is living as we should, as we were designed by our creator to live, not however we please.
  
- III. What True Freedom is not:
  - a. It is not freedom from everything (Eph. 2:10, Titus 2:12, Galatians 2:16)
  - b. It is not a license to keep sinning (Rom. 6)
  - c. It is not complete freedom from our flesh and sin nature on this side of heaven (Romans 7, Galatians 5:17)
  - d. It is not impossible (Romans 8:1-4,12-17, John 8: 34-36)
  
- IV. What Freedom is:

    - vi. Fear of Death
  - b. Freedom to:
    - i. Live out our true design in the power of The Holy Spirit for God’s Glory and our maximum joy! (1 Cor. 3:17-18)

- V. Now What?
  - a. Living in freedom does not give us the license to sin against God or hurt others.
  - b. True freedom produces love for God and others. (Galatians 5:13-16, 1 Cor. 6:12-20, 8-10)
  - c. 1 Peter 2:16, “Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as servants of God.” ESV
