

Creator & Creation is foundational


We make this distinction because of *how* God created:

- "Creatio ex nihilo" = Creation out of nothing
- There was nothing before God created it
 - Land nor sea
 - Planets nor galaxies
 - Matter nor singularity
 - Time nor space

Creator & Creation helps us


It might seem simple and trivial, but it's important!

- What is sin?
 - Not recognizing your creatureliness; unbelief
 - Not living as we were designed; disobedience
 - Failing to take care of creation; poor stewardship
 - Loving a created thing improperly; idolatry



"Our God is in the heavens: he does all that he pleases. Their idols are silver and gold, the work of human hands. They have mouths, but do not speak; eyes, but do not see." Ps 115:3-5

- Idols are created



Creator & Creation helps us

It might seem simple and trivial, but it's important!

- Understanding our creatureliness means understanding that we have limits, and it's a good thing!
 - The perfect pastor doesn't save the world, that's God's job
 - My role as a father is different from Adele's role as mother, and that's beautiful!

Creator & Creation helps us


It might seem simple and trivial, but it's important!

- Understanding our creatureliness means understanding who our Creator is!
 - He's the real authority
 - He's our salvation
 - He's your *personal* creator

- They all get the division wrong in some way or another
- I want to briefly touch on:
 - Ancient pagans
 - Gnosticism
 - Atheism ("functional atheism")


Pagan Myths:

- Brought gods into creation in some way or another
- Creation is chaos




Gnosticism:

- A frequent error combated by early Christianity
 - Gnostics wrote their own "gospels"
- Divided the world between matter and spirit
- Matter is either:
 - Evil and must be overcome
 - Unimportant and gets in the way



Atheism:

- Doesn't acknowledge a creator at all
 - What fills that gap?
- Doesn't acknowledge our own creaturliness and limits
 - Leads to arrogance, or despair!
- "Functional Atheism" is the threat for Christians
 - Living as if God didn't exist
