

Life Issues




- starting point: God's purpose for mankind
 - Genesis 1:28: "fill the earth and subdue it"
 - Deuteronomy 6:5: "love the Lord your God..."
 - Leviticus 19:18: "love your neighbor as yourself"
 - Micah 6:8: "to do justice, and to love kindness..."
 - 1 Timothy 3:1: "desires all people to be saved"
 - Matthew 28:19: "disciple all nations"
 - anything else?




- starting point: God's priority for mankind
 - temporal life or eternal life?
 - The Gospel is not that Jesus died so that your temporal life could be good!
 - The Gospel is that Jesus died to pay for your sins so that by faith you will be saved and have eternal life!
 - Matthew 6:25-34




- the family
 - "Now follow the other seven commandments, which relate to our neighbor. Among them is the first and greatest: You shall honor your father and your mother that it may be well with you and you may live long upon the earth. To the position of fatherhood and motherhood God has given special distinction above all positions that are beneath it: He does not simply command us to love our parents, but to honor them."




- the family
 - "We must, therefore, impress this truth upon the young [Deuteronomy 6:7] that they should think of their parents as standing in God's place. They should remember that however lowly, poor, frail, and strange their parents may be, nevertheless, they are the father and the mother given to them by God."



- the family
 - All government and authority in society flows from the role and authority of parents over their children.
 - The purpose of families is not only to bear children and contribute to society but to rear godly children.

 - How can we as disciples of Jesus serve in this arena?




- So what does this mean for...
