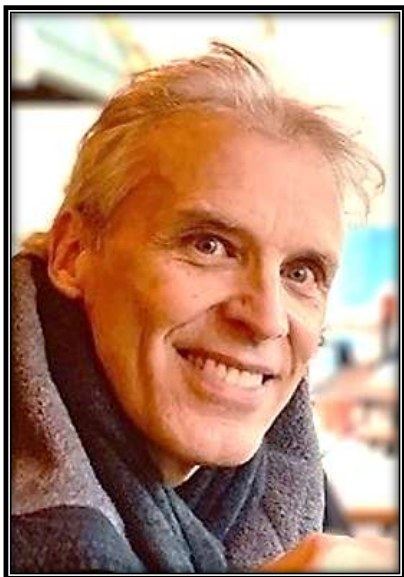

Brian Glen Barnier

February 18, 1962 – January 25, 2026

Brian Glen Barnier entered eternal peace on January 25, 2026, after a courageous and grace-filled journey with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS).

Born on February 18, 1962, in Dearborn, Michigan, Brian was the beloved son of Glenn and Dorothy Barnier. He grew up in Livonia, Michigan, and later graduated from the University of Michigan, earning both his undergraduate degree in business and a Master of Business Administration. Growing up, he was a member of the

Redford Township Unicycle Club and spent many Thanksgiving days riding his 12 foot unicycle with the club in the Detroit Thanksgiving Day parade, as well as many other local parades.

Brian was a man of deep faith, quiet strength, and uncommon kindness. He loved his Savior and lived his faith through integrity, humility, and compassion. Even as illness narrowed his physical world, his mind and spirit remained expansive – curious, thoughtful, and deeply present.

Above all titles and accomplishments, Brian had a rare ability to listen with intention and to make others feel seen, respected, and valued. He was a connector of people. Brian valued the power of relationships and believed that we are stronger together.

Conversations mattered to him. Ideas mattered. But people mattered most. His professional life reflected that same care and thoughtfulness. Brian was the co-founder of Think.Design.Cyber and the CyberTheory Institute, where he helped bridge the worlds of boards, executives, cybersecurity leaders, and compliance professionals. He pioneered systems and industrial design thinking in cybersecurity, challenging outdated methods and advocating for approaches that honored both effectiveness and humanity.

Brian was the author of *The Operational Risk Handbook* (Harriman House, 2011), used internationally as a textbook, and a co-author of foundational frameworks including ISACA's Risk IT and COBIT, and the Shared Assessments Program. His work earned him distinguished recognition, including ISACA's Joseph J. Wasserman Award and the V. Lee Conyers Award. Yet accolades were never his focus—impact and integrity were.

Brian traveled extensively and loved engaging with people across cultures. Wherever he went, he carried warmth, curiosity, and generosity of spirit. His life touched far more people than he ever realized.

Beyond his professional life, Brian had a deep love for the water. Sailing was one of his great joys and sources of peace. He was the longest-serving member of the Candlewood Yacht Club, where he spent countless hours on Candlewood Lake—sailing, swimming, tending to his boat and the club, and finding freedom and clarity on the water. For Brian, sailing was not just a pastime; it was a way of being—present, curious, steady, and alive.

Brian was the beloved husband of Prachee Kale, and a cherished brother-in-law to Prapti Kale.

He is also survived by his mother Dorothy Barnier; his sister Pamela Hughes (John); his son Glenn A. Barnier; his daughters Catherine Barnier and Emma Barnier; along with nephews, cousins, an aunt, and an uncle. He was preceded in death by his father Glenn Barnier and his brother Gregory Barnier.

In his final season, Brian showed the same courage and grace that defined his life. Though ALS took much from him physically, it never diminished who he was. He remained himself—gentle, aware, dignified, and deeply loved.

Brian leaves behind a legacy not only of thought leadership and professional contribution, but of human connection, faith, and quiet goodness.

Brian's peace is now complete. His presence will be missed beyond words. His impact endures—in the lives he touched, the conversations he shaped, and the love he gave so freely.
