Jesus' Divine and Human Nature

The humanity of Jesus was required. God in His righteousness required man to adhere to the law, to be sinless, loving God and his neighbor perfectly. We failed and Jesus humbled Himself and took our place as a man, as the only possible susbstitute. This was only possible if He became like us in all things. Except for our sinful nature, He was.

⁴ But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, made of a woman, made under the law,

⁵ to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons. (Galations 4:4-5)

Jesus' Divine and Human Nature

The divine and natural nature remained separate but unified. Jesus was at the same time both God and man. When Jesus suffered, God and man suffered. When Jesus died, both God and man died.

"For our simple Christian faith proves that God's Son, who became man, suffered for us, died for us and redeemed us with His blood." (The Formula of Concord Art. VIII, 45)
