
THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE MUNDANE







Far too often, many people have fairly fragmented lives...




SACRED/SECULAR SPLIT?

... As a parent, all I have to do is make sure my kids go to church. Check. My role as a Christian parent is done. The church will take care of the rest. As a roommate, all I have to do is try to get my other roommates to go to small group with me. Check...


... My role in the household is done. The small group will take care of the rest. As a Christian spouse, all I have to do is go to church with my spouse. Check. As a Christian grandparent, all I have to do is get my kids and grandkids to come to church on Easter and Christmas Eve and Mother's Day. Check. Check. Check."




ALL HOUSEHOLD ACTIVITIES, **BY PARTICIPATION IN SHARED PRAYER** AND BIBLE-READING




ARRANGE THE KINDLING:

- "Insert an occasional prayer at specific times"
- "Get some words of scripture up on the wall"
- "Spend time together playing, eating, having fun" (Remember connection between spending time together and doing spiritual activities together"

STOKE THE FIRE:

"Purposefully extend your household. Bring more Christians into your household by inviting people over for a meal or event. Host a prayer event or regular Bible study in your home. Bringing the sacred into your own secular home can fight against the temptation of the sacred-secular split."

"Together, volunteer for an event that will involve moments of prayer and time in the Bible. For example, you could all volunteer at your church's Vacation Bible School or go on a short-term mission trip together."

ADD ANOTHER LOG:

 "Start inserting short, momentary prayers into your common life. For example, if someone mentions they've had a bad day or are nervous about an upcoming event, just "go live" and say a quick prayer for them on the spot."

 "Pray a quick blessing for people who are headed out the door. Blessings can be as brief as "May God bless you and give you what you need for your big day." Simply start with the words "May God..." and then finish the sentence."

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
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
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
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
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
"It doesn't take much to see your prayer life and word life alter as a household. Fires just need fuel, oxygen, and heat. Get those different pieces together and create a couple of sparks and you never know just what might happen.

"If applying spiritual disciplines together in your household seems like a daunting new endeavor, remember that this household habit is really quite old and is how God intended households to function from the very beginning...

....Your household is made for this!"
