Gregory Thomas Barnier

Beloved Gregory Thomas Barnier peacefully went to his Savior on February 19, 2023, following a 48 - year battle with Neurofibromatosis Type 2. NF2 is a rare disorder resulting in multiple benign tumors of the brain and spine. It is often misdiagnosed for years. Take time to learn more to protect your family and friends. Since age 10, he had at least 12 brain surgeries and 5 spinal surgeries. Because of the tumors, he lost vision in one eye when he was 10 years old and lost all hearing when he was 30 years old.

Regardless NF2, Greg was positive, active and made health a priority to continually endure and

recover from the numerous surgeries. Over the years he enjoyed swimming, road cycling, Taekwondo, triathlons, unicycling, golf, ice skating, snow skiing, baseball, and soccer. He was a MSU sports and Detroit Tiger's baseball fan. Growing up, he was a member of the Redford Township Unicycle Club and spent many Thanksgiving Days riding his 8 foot unicycle with the club in the Detroit Thanksgiving Day parade. More recently, Greg could be found regularly swimming 30-60 laps at the Livonia Recreation Center and taking his recumbent trike for a ride on Hines Drive, in Petoskey or around his neighborhood. In 2019, the Michigan Fitness Foundation recognized Greg as a finalist for the Governor's Fitness Award.

Greg was an avid adventure traveler, and eagerly explored many countries and lived a full life. Destinations on Greg's travel list were far and wide, and included Australia, Thailand, and Europe, but his favorite place was Hawaii. His 2018 trip to Maui included zip-lining, horseback riding, swimming and hiking using his trekking poles for balance.

Greg graduated from Bentley High School in 1982. He was enthusiastic about the marching band trumpet section and swim team. His passion for skiing grew on a sophomore ski club trip to Steamboat Springs, Colorado. He graduated from Madonna University in Information Systems. Greg previously attended MSU.

Greg did not pray for an easy life, he prayed for the strength to endure. He was always grateful for the encouragement and love of his parents who sought out the latest NF2 treatments and best doctors which allowed him to maintain his quality of life and reach his goals.

Living with NF2, Greg dug deep within himself to find the mental strength to keep going every day. Greg said, "The enemy is frustration and the desire to quit. Never Give Up."

He will be remembered by all who knew him for his love for his Savior, enthusiasm for life, and resilience in the face of his setbacks.

The Apostle Paul wrote to the Philippians, "Yes, and I will rejoice, for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain."
