

THE PRESENT

 MOST OF OUR CALLINGS ARE UNFOLDING RIGHT NOW

"GOD BESTOWS COUNTLESS BLESSINGS UPON THOSE WHO LIVE PRESENT-TENSE LIVES":

- AN AWARENESS THAT HE IS ALREADY AT WORK THROUGH US
 - FINDING JOY IN DAILY SERVICE.
 - CONTENTMENT
- VALUING OTHERS IN WHO THEY ARE NOT JUST BY WHAT THEY ACCOMPLISH

OUR BAPTISMAL IDENTITY

OUR BAPTISMAL CALLING IS...

PAST TENSE:

"THROUGH IT, GOD GRAFTS US INTO THE LIFE,
DEATH, AND RESSURECTION OF JESUS. WHAT
OCCURRED MORE THAN TWO THOUSAND YEARS
AGO - LONG BEFORE ANY OF US AND APART FROM
OUR EFFORTS OR ACTIVITY - BECOMES FULLY
OURS THROUGH FAITH"

OUR BAPTISMAL CALLING IS...

PRESENT TENSE:

"THE SOURCE OF OUR IDENTITY, SECURITY, AND MEANING COMES NOT FROM OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS OR ACHIVEMENTS, POWER OR PRESITGE, FAME OR FORTURE, BUT SOLELY FROM WHOM WE HAVE BEEN MADE IN CHRIST JESUS"

OUR BAPTISMAL CALLING IS...

PRESENT TENSE:

"AND I AM SURE OF THIS, THAT HE WHO BEGAN A
GOOD WORK IN YOU WILL BRING IT TO COMPLETION
AT THE DAY OF JESUS CHRIST."
PHILIPPIANS 1:6 (ESV)

OUR BAPTISMAL CALLING IS... FUTURE TENSE:

"BECAUSE I KNOW THE ONE WHO HOLDS THE FUTURE - I CAN BE AT PEACE WITH WHAT'S TO COME... WHAT WORRIES CAN OUTWEIGH HIS LOVE? WHAT ANXIETIES SPEAK LOUDER THAN HIS ETERNAL VOICE?"

A PRAYER:

"Make me present in Your presence, O God. Turn my untrusting eyes away from the gods of my past, which shackle me by shame and guilt. Refocus my sight not upon faithless fears of the future, but solely upon the work of Christ Jesus, whose wounds alone make all things new....

A PRAYER, continued:

By your Spirit, give me new eyes that behod in those placed on my path a calling of love and service.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."
