Marion Edith Paulson, age 99, passed away July 28, 2022. Beloved wife of Keith. Cherished mother of James (Dianne) Paulson. Exceptionally caring and equally loving, Marion Paulson was a remarkable woman to know and love. She lived a life devoted to her faith and gave so much of herself to the family she loved. Her warm spirit and generous ways will surely be missed and fondly remembered for generations to come.

Born to Melvin and Mary Gould on the eastside of Detroit near the Detroit River, Marion Edith, entered the world on October 25, 1922.

During her early years with her two older brothers, William and John (Jack), Marion survived hard times. The Depression years were deeply embedded in their developing years.

Not to be forgotten was the meeting of the love of her life, Keith Paulson. He was in the Air Force and stationed at Selfridge. The two of them met at a USO-Detroit News Hiking Club event. The two of them hit it off right from the start which resulted in him hitchhiking back to base because he missed the last bus!

After the war had ended, Keith proposed and the rest was history! Once married in 1946 at Faith Lutheran Church, the newlyweds moved into her mother's home in Detroit to help ease her loneliness after Marion's father had died. Together they had two sons, James in 1949 and Thomas in 1951 who was stillborn. Later in 1960, Keith and Marion bought a house in Livonia where her mother lived with them until her death.

Marion modeled a beautiful example of living life to the fullest. She was a very devoted mother and grandmother and loved her family unconditionally. Always cheerful and easy-going, Marion will surely be missed by the many special friends and family she leaves behind.
