She is survived by her devoted and caring husband of 43 years, Mark, sisters Kathleen Beauman, Jeanne Fricke, Jennifer Smith, brother Daniel Johnson and a number of nieces and nephews.

She is survived by her loving children, son Cameron Wludyka and daughter Allyson Ernest, daughter-in-law Malarie Wludyka and son-in-law Michael Ernest. Her two grandchildren, Hudson Ernest and Selah Ernest, were the apples of her eye.

Mary loved cold and snowy days and was truly at home in Ludington, MI. With Christmas as her favorite holiday, the weather provided an excellent backdrop. Mary was an avid crossword puzzler and a frequent viewer of the Hallmark Channel, cooking shows, and she never missed an episode of Survivor.

Following her retirement as an Office Manager with the Diversion Program in Westland, MI, she decided to start her own business and developed "Mary Margaret's Shortbread", based on her Scottish grandmother's shortbread cookie recipe.
