God Remembered Noah

Genesis 7:17-8:5

God's perfect justice is seen in the global flood, while revealing the breathtaking nature of His grace toward those He remembers.

Reflection Questions:

1. How does understanding God's perfect justice deepen your appreciation for His grace and mercy in your own life?
2. In what ways do we treat our relationship with God as transactional rather than relational, and how can we shift that perspective?
3. How does the concept of science serving as a minister to Scripture rather than a magistrate over it affect your view of faith and reason?
4. What does it mean that creation's primary purpose is to testify of God's love and power, and how does this challenge our modern secular worldview?
5. Why do you think people struggle with the severity of God's judgment in the flood, and what does this reveal about our understanding of holiness?
6. How does the corruption of our moral reasoning by sin affect our ability to judge what is truly just or unjust?
7. What does it mean that God remembered Noah, and how does this concept apply to believers who feel forgotten or overlooked by God today?
8. How does recognizing that sin against an infinite God requires infinite punishment change your understanding of what Christ accomplished on the cross?
9. In what ways do we attempt to appease God through religious activity rather than resting in the finished work of Christ?
10. How should the reality that we are safely tucked away inside Christ affect the way we face trials, judgment, and the struggles of daily life?
