

Reflection Questions June 2, 2024 Sola – Week 5 – Soli Deo Gloria Psalm 19:1-4

We have reached the final installment in our series on the '5 Solas' of the Reformation. As we consider Soli Deo Gloria, or 'for God's glory alone', we will be encouraged as individuals to seek God's glory in all aspects of life and to let His glory reform our families, work, worship, and communities.

## **Reflection Questions:**

- 1. How does the concept of soli Deo Gloria, or living for the glory of God alone, impact your understanding of the gospel?
- 2. Can you think of any examples from your own life where you have sought your own glory instead of God's glory? How can you shift your focus to live more for His glory?
- 3. What does it mean to be captivated by God's glory? How can we cultivate a heart that is truly captivated by Him?
- 4. Can you think of any modern-day examples of individuals who have lived their lives solely for God's glory? How does their example inspire you?
- 5. Why do you think it is important to constantly seek more and more of God's glory, even when we have already experienced His presence in our lives?
- 6. The message talks about seeking God's glory in everyday actions, such as washing dishes or caring for children. How can we practically do this and make even the mundane tasks bring glory to God?
- 7. How does the understanding of soli Deo Gloria impact our relationships with others? How can we ensure that our interactions with others are driven by a desire to bring glory to God?
- 8. The message emphasizes the need to reorient our worship to focus on God's glory rather than our own preferences or desires. How can we make sure that our worship is centered on glorifying God?
- 9. What steps can we take to cast down our idols and truly live for the glory of God alone?
