Glory of the Incarnation – The Person Philippians 2:5-11

Before time began, Christ existed in the very form of God, sharing His divine nature and attributes. This wasn't merely resembling God—it was being God. Yet the stunning reality is that He who needed nothing chose to descend to us who needed everything.

Reflection Questions:

- 1. How does understanding Jesus as both fully God and fully human change the way you relate to Him in your daily life and struggles?
- 2. Paul writes that we should have the same mind as Christ, who did not use His equality with God to His own advantage. In what areas of your life are you tempted to use your gifts, position, or privileges for personal gain rather than to serve others?
- 3. What would it look like practically for you to adopt the attitude of Christ, who considered no task beneath Him, in your workplace, family, or church community?
- 4. The cross was once a symbol of ultimate shame and humiliation, yet Christ willingly embraced it. What modern equivalent of shame or humiliation might God be calling you to embrace for the sake of the gospel?
- 5. Paul experienced a complete transformation from persecutor to apostle after encountering the risen Christ. What would it take for you to surrender an area of your life where you have been resistant to Christ's lordship?
- 6. Scripture reveals that every knee will bow and every tongue confess that Jesus is Lord, either in salvation or in judgment. How does this reality motivate you to share the gospel with urgency and compassion?
- 7. Jesus forever retains His human nature even in His exalted state, showing God's permanent identification with humanity. How does knowing that God eternally chose to be identified with you impact your sense of worth and identity?
