Days 5-7 – Creation Concluded

Genesis 1:20-2:3

Creation continues! This week we look at the final days of creation, where God filled the earth with sea creatures, birds, land animals, and ultimately mankind - created uniquely in His image. This account is not merely historical but foundational to understanding who we are, why we exist, and how we should live.

Reflection Questions:

1. How does understanding that God created everything with intentional purpose and design change the way you view your own life and calling?
2. In what ways does the doctrine of being made in the image of God (Imago Dei) shape how we should treat other people, especially those who hold different beliefs or lifestyles?
3. The pastor argues that evidence alone rarely converts unbelievers because of their underlying desire for autonomy from God. How does this understanding affect your approach to evangelism and apologetics?
4. What are the practical implications of believing that humans have dominion over creation rather than being equal to or subservient to nature?
5. How does accepting evolutionary theory as compatible with Genesis undermine the authority of Scripture and the consistency of God's character as described in the sermon?
6. The sermon states that natural selection encourages selfishness while Scripture teaches sacrificial love. How does your worldview on origins affect your daily ethical decisions?
7. How does the concept of the seventh day rest point forward to the ultimate rest promised in Christ, and how should this shape our weekly rhythm of work and worship?
8. Romans 1:18-20 suggests that people suppress the truth about God that is evident in creation. Where do you see this suppression happening in your own life or in the culture around you?
