

Reflection Questions December 21, 2025

Glory of the Incarnation – The Purpose Galatians 4:4-7

This week, we conclude our Advent series "The Glory of the Incarnation" by exploring one of the most profound truths in all of Scripture: that through Christ, we have not only been redeemed from slavery to sin, but adopted as beloved children of God.

Reflection Questions:

- 1. How does understanding that Jesus came 'in the fullness of time' change the way you view God's timing in your own life circumstances?
- 2. In what ways do you struggle to see God as a loving Father rather than merely as a Redeemer or taskmaster, and what would it look like to approach Him differently?
- 3. When have you experienced God's love in a way that reminded you it wasn't based on your performance?
- 4. What does it mean practically for you that Jesus lived a perfect life under the Law before going to the cross, and why is this essential to your salvation?
- 5. How does the doctrine of the hypostatic union—that Jesus is fully God and fully Man—give you confidence that He can relate to your specific struggles and temptations?
- 6. Other religions require us to ascend to God. How does the truth that God descended to us in Christ reshape your understanding of salvation?
- 7. If you truly believed you were adopted as a son or daughter of God and not just a freed slave, how would your prayer life and relationship with God change?
- 8. What areas of your life reveal that you still approach God transactionally—believing He blesses you when you're good and punishes you when you fail?
- 9. How does being an heir of God through adoption impact the way you view your identity, worth, and future hope?
