



## Reflection Questions

June 28, 2026

The Coming Judgment

Genesis 6:5-22

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This week, we explore God's response to humanity's complete corruption in Noah's day and the profound parallels to our own time.

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### Reflection Questions:

1. How does the reality that sin affects all of creation, not just humanity, shape your understanding of our responsibility as God's image-bearers in caring for the world around us?
2. In what ways do you see society today mirroring the conditions of Noah's time, where every intention of the heart was only evil continually, and how should Christians respond?
3. God relates to us using terms like grief and regret so we can understand His nature. How does this help you reconcile God's unchanging nature with His emotional responses to human sin?
4. Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord before he built the ark or demonstrated obedience. How does this challenge or affirm your understanding of the relationship between grace, faith, and works?
5. What does it mean practically for you to walk with God like Noah did, especially in a culture that increasingly rejects biblical values?
6. There are over 270 flood stories across different cultures worldwide. How can examining external evidence like this strengthen your faith?
7. How does viewing the ark as a picture of salvation through Christ alone impact the way you understand the exclusivity of the gospel message?
8. Noah obeyed God without speaking a single recorded word in Genesis 6. What does his silent obedience teach us about faith and trust in God's commands, even when they seem unreasonable?
9. Peter warns that scoffers will come saying all things continue as they were from the beginning. How can we maintain urgency about Christ's return without falling into date-setting or fear-based Christianity?
