The Dragon Slayer

Genesis 3:15; Revelation 12:3-6, 22:3-5

We've been talking a lot lately about serpents and dragons! This week we continue to proclaim the victory of the Ultimate Dragon Slayer, Jesus Christ in a special 5th Sunday Family Worship Service!

Reflection Questions:

1. How does the ancient story pattern of a dragon, a captive princess, and a rescuing knight reveal our deep longing for salvation and redemption?
2. In what ways do we still fall for the same lie the serpent told Eve, believing that God is withholding something good from us?
3. Adam failed to rescue Eve from the serpent's deception. How does this challenge our understanding of human responsibility and our need for a better rescuer?
4. When we sin, do we tend to hide from God like Adam and Eve, or do we confess our sins trusting in 1 John 1:9? What keeps us from honest confession?
5. How does Satan make sin look appealing on the outside while hiding its destructive consequences, and where do you see this deception most clearly in our culture today?
6. Scripture describes Satan operating both as a deceiving serpent and a destroying dragon. Which tactic do you find more dangerous in your own spiritual life, and why?
7. What does it mean practically to fight the dragon through prayer, Bible study, and standing on truth in your everyday life as a follower of Jesus?
8. How does knowing that the dragon's time is short and his defeat is certain change the way we face spiritual opposition and suffering in this present age?
9. By the blood of the Lamb we have already conquered. How does this past-tense victory impact your present-tense battles with temptation and fear?
10. What does the promise of living happily ever after with Jesus, free from the dragon's influence, mean for how we invest our time and energy in this temporary world?
