The Table of Nations

Genesis 10

This week we look at Genesis 10. Far from being a dry list of names, this passage reveals a God who is sovereign over all of human history, who orchestrates the rise and fall of nations, and who never loses sight of His promise to send One who would crush the head of the serpent.

Reflection Questions:

1. Genesis 10 reveals that God is intimately aware of the rise and fall of every nation throughout history -- how should this truth shape the way we respond to political instability, cultural decline, or national threats that cause us fear and anxiety today?
2. All communication has a purpose and a desired response. This principle applies to God's Word as well -- are there portions of Scripture you have consistently skimmed or dismissed, and what might you be missing by doing so?
3. Nimrod is described as a mighty man who built kingdoms in opposition to God, and yet his cities became some of the most powerful empires in history -- what does this tell us about the difference between worldly greatness and greatness in God's eyes?
4. Daniel 2:44-45 describes a kingdom that will break all other kingdoms and stand forever -- in what practical ways does believing in the permanence of God's kingdom change how you invest your time, energy, and hope in the kingdoms of this world?
5. The Israelites possessed knowledge of history -- including the origins of Egypt - - that the Egyptians themselves did not have, because it came from God -- how does access to God's Word give believers a distinct perspective on the world that should affect the way we live and speak?
6. Believers are to share the message that only God's kingdom lasts forever with people who are placing all their hope in temporary, man-made systems -- what are the specific barriers in your life that make it difficult to carry that message to the people around you?
