The First 4 Days

Genesis 1:1-19

This week, we explore the first four days of creation as recorded in Genesis 1:1-19, examining how God brought order out of chaos, light out of darkness, and form to the formless void.

Reflection Questions:

1. How does understanding the Trinity's involvement in creation (Father, Word, and Spirit) deepen your appreciation for God's work in your own salvation?
2. In what ways does viewing Genesis through a Christ-centered lens change how you read the Old Testament, and how might this perspective impact your daily walk with God?
3. The sermon describes our hearts before salvation as an unformed, unfilled deep. How does this metaphor help you understand the transformation God has worked in your life?
4. How do you respond to the challenge of materialism in our culture, and what practical ways can you point others to the reality of God as Creator?
5. Why is it significant that God called the light good and separated it from darkness, and how does this reflect the spiritual reality of holiness and separation from sin?
6. Scripture uses the word 'bara,' a word used only for divine creation. How does understanding that only God can create ex nihilo impact your view of His sovereignty over your circumstances?
7. King David marveled that God would be mindful of humanity despite the vastness of creation. How does contemplating the immensity of the universe affect your understanding of God's personal love for you?
8. What does it mean that all things are held together by the Word of God, and how should this truth influence the way you face uncertainty or chaos in life?
9. How does recognizing that plants were created fully mature and functioning challenge evolutionary assumptions, and what implications does this have for trusting God's Word over cultural narratives?
