# Message Notes

### April 28, 2024 You Asked For It: What should I know about "the rapture"? Matthew 24:36-41; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Revelation 3:10

The Rapture - a future event when some believe Jesus will secretly return to take believers to heaven before a period of great tribulation that will fall upon the earth. All this comes before Jesus' true second coming when he establishes his Kingdom reign.

**What is the stance of the GMC?** There is no stance. Refer to the following questions/answers in the GMC catechism for our beliefs about the "end times". #15, #35, and #77 - summarized here:

- Jesus will come again in glory
- His Kingdom will have no end
- There will be a resurrection of the dead
- It will be a bodily resurrection

#### History of Rapture Theology:

- 1830 Margaret MacDonald had a "rapture" vision during a revival in Scotland
- John Nelson Darby carried this belief/teaching to the UK and USA in the 1900s
- These teachings caught fire during the suffering of the Civil War
- This Dispensational theology was further proliferated through the Scofield Reference Bible, Moody Bible Institute, and Dallas Theological Seminary
- Rapture conversations and thought have found even more life since the 1990s with the Left Behind book series by Tim LaHaye & Jerry B. Jenkins as well as subsequent movies

#### Is "the rapture" in the Bible?

- Matthew 24:36-41 You actually want to be left behind!
- 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 We will join Jesus in the clouds as he COMES TO EARTH!
- Revelation 3:10 Jesus may sustain us through suffering, but the Bible tells us to expect to suffer for our faith.
