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QUESTIONS:

Read Psalm 19 and the Belgic Confession Article 2 (below) and then build a discussion with these questions:

1. Have you ever experienced the presence of God in nature? If so share the story.
2. Examine Psalm 19 and BC Article 2. How can God speak to us in nature? What might that look like?
3. What are the challenges in our world that keep us from the natural, untamed and wild?
4. What might be some cautions for relying too heavily on creation as a means to connect with God? What role do the Scriptures play?

Belgic Confession Article 2: The Means by Which We Know God

We know God by two means:

First, by the creation, preservation, and government of the universe, since that universe is before our eyes like a beautiful book

in which all creatures, great and small, are as letters to make us ponder the invisible things of God:

God's eternal power and divinity, as the apostle Paul says in Romans 1:20.

All these things are enough to convict humans and to leave them without excuse.

POST STUDY CHALLENGE:

Grab out your schedules and set a time over the next week where you can go on a nature walk. It could be in the river valley, Elk Island park, or anywhere filled with nature! Before you go on the walk, read Psalm 19. Ask God to speak to you. Ask God to make you aware of His presence and show you something. Go on your walk with an awareness and expectation of God. Talk to God on your walk. Come back and share with your Home Group.
