

Bridge Church Home Groups Questions

Series: Finding Chemistry with God Message: Loving God through Ritual and Symbol Pastor Ryan Pedde

NOTE: Some questions are adapted from back section of Sacred Pathways from Gary Thomas.

QUESTIONS:

- 1. What is your general disposition towards "tradition"? When you hear the word is it positive or negative to you? Explain.
 - a. Where do you see tradition at work in the life of your family or in our church?
- 2. Read Exodus 12:21-27. God was doing something momentous in the life of the Hebrew nation, freeing them from slavery in Egypt. He wanted them to memorialize this event as a true "God thing" in their history so that they would never forget this miraculous rescue.
 - a. What does God call them to do as a ritual?
 - b. What symbols are used to trigger remembrance?
- 3. Read Luke 22:7-20. Jesus' last meal before going to the cross was the Passover celebration at which he instituted a new memorial for his followers. What do the bread and wine symbolize? What are the parallels between the Passover shedding of a lamb's blood and Jesus' shedding of his own blood? How can communion take on new meaning as you embrace the elements Jesus gave us in remembrance of Him?
- 4. What are some of the dangers of relying too much on tradition? Hint: Think of Jesus interactions with the Pharisees.
 - a. What is the difference between valuing tradition vs traditional-ism?
 - b. When is tradition healthy? When is it not?

CHALLENGE:

Dream up a ritual or symbol you can do as a Home Group together to deepen faith in Jesus. Try it out for one week. It could include a daily times of prayer. It could be putting a cross over your doorway. Whatever you think! Reflect in your next meeting what effect it had on your walk with God.
