12:1-12 – The parable of the *vine-grower*.

This illustration is taken from *Isaiah 5:1-7*.

A picture of the *rejection of Jesus* (the “son”).

Ends with a quote from a Messianic psalm: *118:22-23*.

12:13-17 – Attempting to set a trap for Jesus with *insincere flattery*.

12:14-27 – Attempting to set a trap by having Jesus *take sides*.

12:18-34 – The scribe who almost got it right!

The most significant part of the scribe's response:

“You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”

Significance of this statement: it's not new!

12:35-44 – In the temple compound, Jesus teaches three lessons:

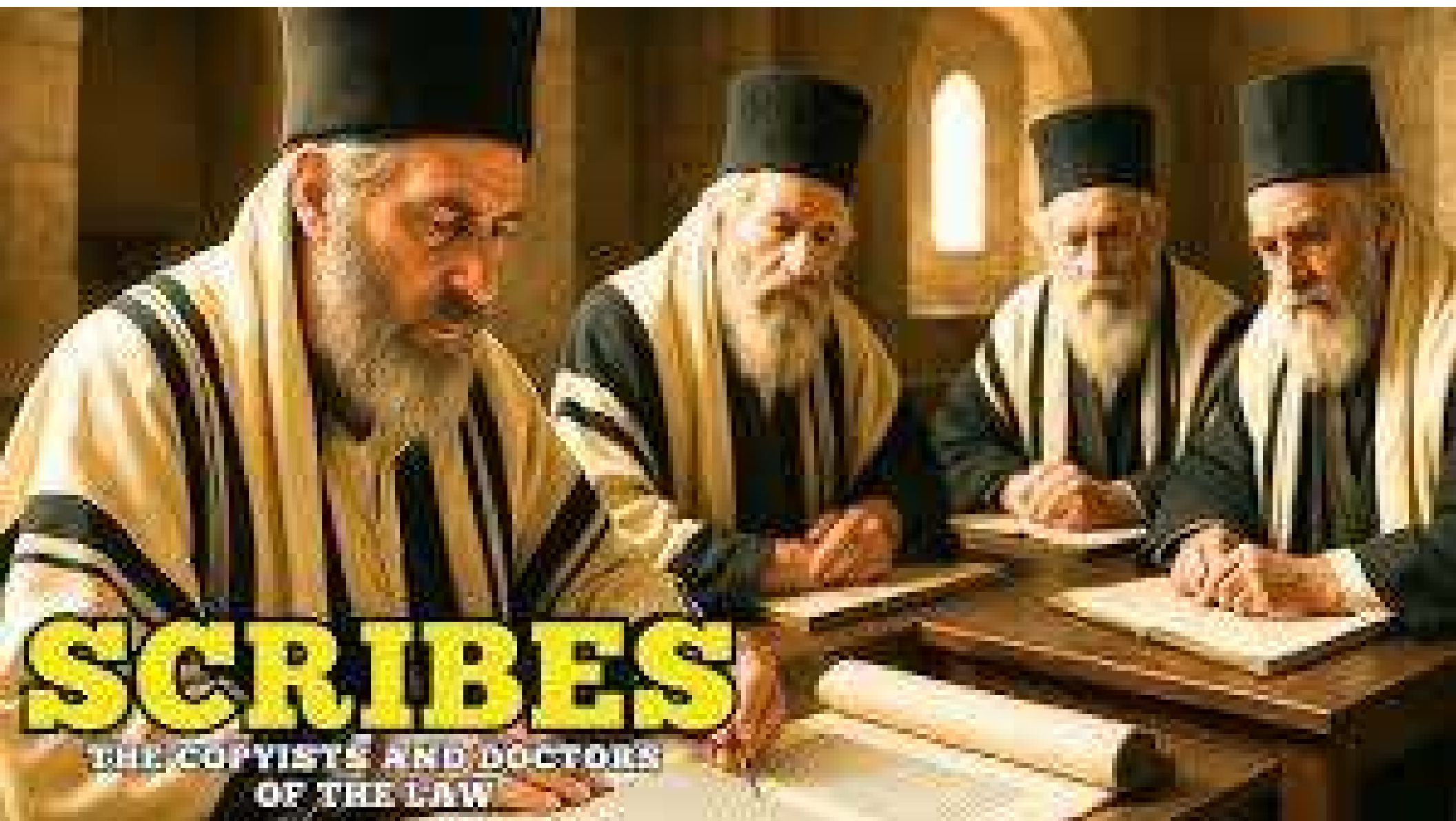
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#2: By hypocrisy of the spiritual leaders, greater condemnation.
