Micah 6:8

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

There are two basic ideas about religion. One is SACRIFICE: things, good works.... The other is RELATIONSHIP with Him. This morning, we're going to look at not what is in our HANDS for God but what is in our HEARTS towards HIM.

1. WALK humbly with your God.

Genesis 5:23

Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away.

2. Walk **HUMBLY** with your God.

Humility also translated as "gentleness" and "meekness" is not in a person's outward behavior... nor in relations to his fellow-men... rather it is an inwrought grace of the soul; and it is first and chiefly towards God.

Numbers 12:3

Now Moses was a very humble man, more humble than anyone else on the face of the earth.

3. Walk humbly **WITH** your God.

Amos 3:3

Do two walk together unless they have agreed to do so?

Matthew 11:28-29

²⁸ Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light."

4. Walk humbly with YOUR God.

John 6:66-68

⁶⁶ From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. ⁶⁷ "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve. ⁶⁸ Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. ⁶⁹ We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

5. Walk humbly with your **GOD**.

John 21:18-19

¹⁸ Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." ¹⁹ Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, "Follow me!"
