Jesus Teaching on Marriage and Divorce

Matthew 19:1-12

Main Idea:

Jesus exposes the prevailing view of the Pharisees that divorce could be "for any reason at all" as biblically inaccurate and sinful. Rather, designed and ordained by God, marriage is to be cherished and nurtured according to God's instructions.

6 points to help us understand Jesus' teaching on marriage and divorce.

- 5) The Teaching
 - 2 points that define and govern the institution of marriage:
 - Jesus LIMITS marriage to one man and one woman
 - Jesus EXPLAINS that the purpose of marriage is for the man and woman to become one indivisible unity.

- 2 corrections of the Pharisees' mistaken thinking about divorce:
 - Divorce is a product of man's sin
 - God did not command divorce in the Law, he merely permited it
- Divorce may be permissible (and even necessary) for believer, but only for 2 reasons:
 - Unrepentant, serious sexual immorality of a spouse
 - Abandonment of the marriage by an unbelieving spouse
- When singleness is right for a believer
