Main Idea:

Jesus is the unmistakable, perfect fulfilment of the Old Testament's many prophecies of the Messiah. To refuse to recognize who He is, and to not believe in Him is irrational.

How might you use the record of Old Testament prophecies fulfilled in Jesus as a means of sharing the gospel with an unbeliever?

#4 Reflecting on the Lord's incarnation, and especially His entry into Jerusalem in Matthew 21, how will His second coming be different? (see: Rev. 19:11 ff).
