

Main Idea:

#2	Why do you think God prizes obedience and humility so highly in His servants?
#3	What is humility, anyway? Define it biblically. How did David model humility in 1 Samuel 16?
#4	What do we mean when we say that God is sovereign? How might you explain God's sovereignty to a new believer?
#5	Has God ever placed you in a difficult situation that you initially did not understand His purpose in, and then have it all make sense later on after persevering through a season of challenge and uncertainty?
	How does God strengthen us in such times?
#6	Why was David's willingness to serve Saul (in the palace) a powerful expression of his faith in God?
#7	How did David's faithfulness to God and trust in His sovereign plan position him to be used and blessed by God?
