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**15 Implications of the Transfiguration**

**1. Deity**

- a. Heb 1:3; John 4:24
- b. Therefore, we should honor Him and worship Him for who He is. Our worship and life should reflect the truth of His deity, His authority, and His character.

**2. Trinity**

- a. Mark 1:9-11; Matt 28:19
- b. Therefore, we should rightly worship the one living and true God, perfect in all His attributes, one in essence, eternally existing in three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—each equally deserving worship and obedience.

**3. Exaltation**

- a. Phil 2:9-11
- b. Therefore, all honor, glory, and praise are due to Him. He is worthy of our worship and of our presenting our bodies as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God as our spiritual service of worship (Rom 12:2).

**4. Kingdom**

- a. Dan 7:14; Zech 14:9; Mark 13:26
- b. Therefore, we should live in anticipation of Christ's return, looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus (Titus 2:13).

**5. Vindication**

- a. Isaiah 9:6-7
- b. Therefore, while evil doers seem to flourish in this life, we can trust that it is only temporary, and they will be perfectly and swiftly judged when Christ returns.

**6. Covenant**

- a. 2 Cor 3:7-4:6; Heb 8:1-13
- b. Therefore, we should take great comfort in knowing our great High Priest sympathizes with our weaknesses; He was tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin. We can draw near to the throne of grace (Heb 4:15-16) because we are in Christ, knowing that "He is able to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Heb 7:25).

**7. Restoration**

- a. Malachi 4:5-6; Acts 3:19-21
- b. Therefore, God is deserving of our trust. His Word is true, and He will keep all of His promises.

**8. Resurrection**

- a. John 11:25; 1 Cor 15; Phil 3:20-21

- b. Therefore, we should have hope knowing that this life isn't all there is; we have an eternity awaiting us that we will experience in a glorified body that will be free of sin and the struggles of this life.

## 9. Trials

- a. 2 Cor 4:16-18; Jude 24-25
- b. Therefore, we can know for certain there is no such thing as a purposeless trial in this life. God is perfectly and sovereignly orchestrating every aspect of this life to conform us into the likeness of Christ and one day we will experience a glory far beyond all comparison.

## 10. Transformation

- a. Rom 12:2; 2 Cor 3:18; Col 3:10
- b. Therefore, we should devote our lives to beholding Christ, knowing that we become what we behold and what we worship as we reflect the image of what we most focus on.

## 11. Eternity

- a. 1 Cor 13:12; Rev 21:4; 22:3-5
- b. Therefore, we can rejoice that our citizenship is in heaven; while our life here and now matters, we should live with eternity in mind.

## 12. Mindset

- a. Isaiah 55:8; Col 3:1-3
- b. Therefore, we should never presume upon God and act like we have perfect knowledge of everything. We should stay humble and prayerful as we navigate this life.

## 13. Presence

- a. Matt 17:6, 7; Rom 8:11; Col 1:27; Heb 10:31
- b. Therefore, we recognize our own unworthiness and the impossibility of standing in the presence of God on our own. We rejoice in having Christ as our mediator and for the comforting presence of God dwelling within us.

## 14. Discipleship

- a. Eph 1:17; Col 1:9; 2 Pet 1:16-21
- b. Therefore, we should listen to Him and commit ourselves to the hearing, reading, studying, memorizing, and meditating on the inerrant, infallible, sufficient Word of God.

## 15. Christ

- a. Mark 9:8; Col 1:15-18
- b. Therefore, we should boldly proclaim Christ with our minds, hearts, lips, and lives. Christ is all! All of life is centered on Christ—knowing Him, loving Him, serving Him, honoring Him, proclaiming Him to make Him known, and growing into His likeness. He is the most significant Person in the universe and “all things have been created through Him and for Him” (Col 1:16).
