

# YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE

## Study Guide

### Main Scriptures

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### Message Summary

This message is a wake-up call to every believer that salvation was never meant to stop with us. Jesus did not simply command believers to reach people or create emotional moments. He commanded us to make disciples.

Too often, the church celebrates beginnings while neglecting growth. We celebrate raised hands, altar calls, and emotional services, but discipleship requires more than moments. It requires commitment, obedience, relationship, and responsibility.

Real discipleship means staying with people, walking with people, teaching obedience, loving through inconvenience, and helping others become more like Jesus.

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### Key Truth #1 — Discipleship Begins Where Moments End

A spiritual moment is not the finish line. Discipleship starts after the decision.

Discussion Questions:

- Why do believers often stop at moments?
  - Why is growth just as important as salvation?
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### Key Truth #2 — Jesus Said Make Disciples

Matthew 28:19–20 reminds us that Jesus called believers to baptize people, teach obedience, and help form Christ in others.

Discussion Questions:

- What is the difference between conversion and discipleship?
- How have you personally experienced discipleship?

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## Key Truth #3 — Obedience Is the Evidence

Jesus never separated love from obedience. The goal is not more information or more church moments. The goal is transformation.

Discussion Questions:

- What areas of your life need greater obedience?
  - How can hearing truth without applying it become deception?
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## Key Truth #4 — Discipleship Requires Staying

Real discipleship stays close even when relationships become inconvenient. Discipleship confronts, encourages, walks through disappointment, and carries responsibility.

Discussion Questions:

- Why is staying with people difficult?
  - What causes believers to disconnect too quickly?
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## Key Truth #5 — Responsibility Is Personal

You are not responsible for everyone, but you are responsible for someone.

Discussion Questions:

- Who helped you grow spiritually?
  - Who might God be calling you to disciple?
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## Personal Reflection

- Am I being transformed or just exposed to church?
  - Does my lifestyle reflect what I claim to believe?
  - Have I confused emotional moments with spiritual maturity?
  - Who am I intentionally helping grow in Christ?
  - Have I withdrawn from people when discipleship became inconvenient?
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## Practical Application

1. Identify "The One" and pray for them.
  2. Reach out and connect with them this week.
  3. Open Scripture together.
  4. Stay consistent in relationship.
  5. Model what you teach.

Father, teach us how to disciple the way Jesus disciplined. Help us stop chasing moments while neglecting transformation. Give us courage to stay with people, love people, and walk with people through growth. Show us who You've placed in front of us and help us carry responsibility well.
