

# SENT HOME

## Small Group Study Guide

This study guide is designed to help your small group process the message “**Sent Home**”. The goal is not just information, but transformation. As you discuss together, ask the Lord to shape your home, your rhythms, your relationships, and your legacy.

### Opening Scripture

#### Deuteronomy 6:5–7

“Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. These words that I am giving you today are to be in your heart. Repeat them to your children...”

#### Discussion Questions

- 1 What stood out to you most from this week’s message?
  - 2 Why do you think God places such a strong emphasis on the home?
  - 3 What kind of atmosphere was modeled in your home growing up?
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### Key Truth #1 — Before We Disciple Nations, We Must Disciple Homes

The home is one of God’s greatest discipleship environments. Homes shape identity, communication, values, trust, emotional health, and spiritual formation. Whether intentionally or unintentionally, every home is shaping someone.

#### Discussion Questions

- 1 What are some ways homes shape people beyond words?
  - 2 What rhythms or habits currently shape your home?
  - 3 How can ordinary moments become spiritually meaningful moments?
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## Point 1 — Home Is Your First Assignment

### Joshua 24:15

“As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.”

Spiritual leadership begins at home. Public ministry should never replace private discipleship. Your family is not your side assignment. Your home is holy ground.

### Key Truths

- The church cannot fully disciple what the home constantly contradicts.
- Children absorb what adults normalize.

### Discussion Questions

- 1 What does intentional spiritual leadership look like in everyday life?
  - 2 How can we build healthy culture in our homes?
  - 3 Why is modeling faith just as important as teaching faith?
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## Point 2 — Faith Must Be Seen, Not Just Spoken

Faith was never meant to exist only in church services or religious moments. Scripture shows us that faith should be woven into daily life: when we sit, walk, lie down, and rise.

### Key Truths

- School shapes minds. But home should shape identity.
- What is practiced repeatedly becomes culture naturally.
- Legacy is not built in big moments. It is built in daily repetition.

### Discussion Questions

- 1 What voices currently influence families the most in today's culture?
  - 2 How can parents and mentors become more spiritually intentional?
  - 3 What patterns do children tend to remember most from adults?
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## Point 3 — God Can Rewrite the Story

Some people grew up in healthy homes. Others grew up surrounded by chaos, dysfunction, absence, or pain. But the Gospel is powerful enough to interrupt generational cycles and begin healing.

### Key Truths

- God specializes in rebuilding what life tried to destroy.
- Your past may explain you, but it does not have to define you.
- Sometimes God introduces you to the family you needed at church.

### Discussion Questions

- 1 How does Jesus restore identity and heal brokenness?
  - 2 Why is spiritual family and community so important?
  - 3 What generational cycle are you believing God to break?
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## Application Challenge

This week, intentionally create spiritual moments at home.

### Discussion Questions

- 1 Pray together as a family or with someone close to you.
  - 2 Read Scripture together.
  - 3 Have one intentional spiritual conversation this week.
  - 4 Worship together.
  - 5 Ask God what kind of legacy He wants to build through your life.
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## Closing Reflection

At the end of our lives, people may not remember titles, accomplishments, or platforms. But they will remember how we loved, how we lived, and what we modeled.

### Discussion Questions

- 1 If someone followed Jesus the way they see you follow Jesus, where would they end up?
  - 2 What kind of legacy do you want your life to leave behind?

Lord, heal what is broken in us and in our homes. Help us model Your love, Your truth, and Your presence well. Let prayer rise again in homes. Let worship rise again in homes. Let Your Word live again in homes. May our homes become places of peace, healing, discipleship, and presence. Amen.
