Overview

3. What happens if we only hear the Word but don't do it (v.22-25)?
4. How do our words reflect our true faith (v.26)?
5. What is pure and genuine religion (v.27)?
Scripture Focus: James 3:17-18
Key Themes: Wisdom, Purity, Peace, Sincerity
1. List the characteristics of wisdom from above.
2. How does this kind of wisdom relate to how we disciple others?
3. What are we promised when we plant seeds of peace?
Scripture Focus: Mark 7:6-8
Key Themes: Authentic Worship, Human Tradition, Heart Alignment
1. What does Jesus say about people who only honor God with their lips?
2. How can we ensure our hearts are aligned with God's commands?

3. What does it look like to let go of human traditions in favor of God's truth?
