Lead us, Lord Jesus, we pray.






FIRST TIME REGISTERED GUESTS




GROW GROUPS PARTICIPANTS





MISSIONS UPDATE

In February 2023, CUMC hosted a panel regarding vulnerable and at-risk children and youth in our community. Following this event, three new initiatives arose and are gaining momentum.

Food for Thought started to support the students and staff at West Boulevard Elementary School, a nearby school with a large percentage of students on free and reduced lunch and minimal parent volunteers. What began with a plea for snacks during testing has expanded to 30 church volunteers hosting school-wide parties to celebrate the 330 students and staff.

A spring special offering was collected and the mission team allocated \$2,500 from garage sale funds to help support these parties and to continue providing snacks for students in need. In addition, an anonymous, generous donor donated \$10,000 to support this initiative which will help ensure this partnership continues for multiple years. Huge thanks to Jim Hogan and Lynn Barnett-Sleper for leading this new initiative.

Tags of Hope continues to expand services for foster children and families in our community. The original Tags of Hope boutique has helped over 600 different children through 930+ encounters. May 2023, the CUMC congregation filled 40 iBelong baskets in support of Columbia Foster and Adopt Project. These are given to local foster children as they enter care to meet immediate needs and offer comfort items.

In 2023, CUMC connected with **Care Portal**, a nationwide, online network based out of Kansas City which connects agencies like Children's Division of Family Services with the faith community who can help with specific needs. In support of these efforts, Room 601 and nearby hallways were cleaned and painted for the expanded ministry. In addition to clothing, shoes, books, and stuffed animals, kidfriendly freezer meals are now given to families welcoming a new child into their home to help ease the transition.



MISSIONS UPDATE



Sleep in Heavenly Peace - MO-Columbia has been chartered by Community UMC. This nationwide non-profit builds wooden beds and provides mattresses and bedding to local children to ensure "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town." Four volunteers from CUMC attended training in Utah in August and the first official SHP-MO, Columbia bed build is scheduled for March 9, 2024 sponsored by our CUMC Youth. The CUMC Children's Ministry collected bedding and a generous gift of \$10,000 from the Sechler Memorial Fund was designated to purchase the required tools needed for the bed build days. We are thankful for the leadership team consisting of Brandy Sanchez, Jen Chirillo, Andy Upham, and Kelley Upham.

Rainbow Network - During 2023, the Community UMC family sponsored 63 Rainbow Network students. 7 students graduated, including 2 who graduated from university. Thanks to everyone who shops at The Global Market, sponsors, or prays for one of these Rainbow Network students. Together, these students and their families' lives are changed as they work to escape poverty in rural Nicaragua. The community of Santa Carmela-Casa Blanca continues to send their thanks for the love CUMC has shown.





MONTHLY GIVING



2023 FINAL RESULT: +\$13,484

2023 financials ended in the positive by \$13,484. This is the result of amazing generosity, especially at the end of the year. The graph to the right illustrates the significant generosity in December compared to the rest of the year. This year's giving in December is the highest December in the past five years.

One of the amazing statistics is the balance of our budget. The left graph shows how we are balanced in our priorities of inviting, growing, serving, and transforming. This balance has been an emphasis of church leadership for the past five years.

The giving in 2023 represents the generosity of 267 individuals and families, including 41 first-time givers. The total dollar amount received from all sources was \$863,486, which includes \$49,200 in missional giving. The missional giving was a 30% increase over the previous year.

CHILDREN



Children's ministry has grown to an average of 20-30 kids per week. We have created an environment of acceptance for those with ASD and other disabilities, meeting the kids where they need us to, in order for them to learn all about the love and acceptance of God. We are thankful for the church's continued support, whether it be through a bedding drive for SHP or through candy donations for trunk or treat (200+ attended).





YOUTH

Youth had a busy and fun year participating in events like a retreat, helping with the children's egg hunt, serving at the Food Bank, serving at ForColumbia, painting a cart, and a mission trip to Wausau, WI. They also joined with First Presbyterian for a couple of fun youth group nights exploring the corn maze and celebrating Advent and Christmas together.

The Connect Team works to invite and connect people to Jesus and others. Last year, this team organized events such as an ice cream social, pool party and more for fun and fellowship.
