

PAUL'S LETTER TO THE ROMANS – Beloved Sons of the Living God Community Group Study Guide Romans 9:24-33 – Week of September 11, 2022

## 1. Beloved Sons of the Living God

Those who are Christians are so because God has called them. He has loved them, forgiven them, and has adopted them into His family. The entire process of has transpired because God has willed it to be so. The blessing of adoption has fallen on those whom God has given it to. This gift that is given transforms our entire identity. We are no longer slaves to sin or sons of disobedience. God's redemption has made us slaves to righteousness and co-heirs with Christ. The most important attribute that now describes us is that God loves us. This adoption is what satisfies our soul. So, rejoice, because we are beloved sons of the living God!

## 2. Only a Remanent will Remain

God has only saved those whom He has called. God has decided to love who He will love, and who He will not. God will always save a remnant of His people, a portion that He will call to Himself. A harsh truth for us to understand is that only a minority of people will be saved. The gate of salvation is narrow, and many will not enter it. This is why Jesus encourages us to strive for the narrow gate, to repent during the day of salvation... because one day the gate will be closed. Those who look in from the outside will desire to come in, but will be Jesus will turn them away.

## 3. Don't Stumble over Saving Grace

We must avoid the temptation to stumble over the free grace of God. The Israelites struggled with the Gospel, because it took no account for their works. In contrast, the Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness in their works, were able to obtain it through faith in Jesus Christ. For the Gentiles, the grace of God became a cornerstone; for the Jews, a stumbling block. Humble yourself. Don't stumble over Grace.

#### Head

That God has chosen to adopt us. He has done this by His will for His purpose. We are no longer enemies, but beloved sons of God

#### Heart

We should rejoice that God has called us to Himself. Furthermore, we should see our identity in Christ, not in our old selves. Beyond that, we should continue to grow in the amazement of God's grace, and the humbling of our righteousness

#### Hands

We are to act like the beloved sons that we are. We are called to obey all the commandments God has given us.
