INTRODUCTION — Understanding Where We Are "You can love God... trust God... and still be tired."

Prophetic Telescoping:

God speaks strength BEFORE the storm.

Isaiah 39 — Judgment & Consequence Exile announced. Fatigue inevitable.



Isaiah 40 —



Comfort & Restoration



"Comfort, comfort My people."

Isaiah 41 — Courage & Empowerment "Fear not... I will strengthen you."

Point 1 — Tired Doesn't Mean Faithless

Even the strongest stumbled.

Weary ≠ Weak.

Exhausted ≠ Faithless.

God meets you in your tired place.

Point 2 — Your Tired Place Is Holy

- Elijah collapsed under pressure.
- God met him with bread, water, and presence.
- Provision before instruction.

POINT 2 — YOUR TIRED PLACE IS STILL A HOLY PLACE God meets you in collapse.

Point 3

Worship Is Warfare Worship is resistance, not emotional hype.

A whispered hallelujah shakes hell.

Weak worship still wins wars.

Pastoral Decree

You're not weak—you're worn.

God restores the worn.

Strength is returning to this house.

Heaviness is lifting.

Your spirit will breathe again.
