INTRODUCTION: The Internal War for the Throne

- Obedience is not passive—it proves Lordship.
- The soul is the seat of authority: will, desires, emotions.
- The daily question: Who is seated on your soul's throne?

I. The War for the Soul's Throne

- Obedience is warfare, not weakness.
- Galatians 5:17 Flesh and Spirit are in constant conflict.
- Self vs. Spirit Who rules your soul today?
- Reflection: Which voice have you obeyed more this week?

II. The First Rebellion – Genesis 3

- Desire dethroned God in the garden.
- They obeyed a want, not the Word.
- Satan redirected desire—not forced sin.
- Disobedience starts with internal surrender.

III. The Apostle's Agony – Romans 7

- Paul describes war in his members—saved yet struggling.
- The flesh must be subdued, not entertained.
- Obedience costs—it crucifies the flesh.
- Victory is not by strength but surrender.

IV. The Spirit's Triumph – Romans 8

- No condemnation for those who walk in the Spirit.
- Romans 8:13 The Spirit kills flesh, not comforts it.
- Victory requires soul submission.
- The Spirit is Christ's answer to the war within.

V. The Strategy of Satan

- Satan seeks your throne through disobedience.
- Ephesians 2:2 Disobedience grants him access.
- Rebellion equals witchcraft 1 Samuel 15:23.
- Obedience guards God's rule in your soul.

VI. The Seat Must Be Surrendered

- Sacrifice Luke 9:23 Obedience costs.
- War James 4:7 Resist by first submitting.
- Surrender Romans 6:13 Present yourself.
- Submission secures the King's rule.

VII. Deliverance Focus – Restoring the Seat

- Repentance re-seats God in the soul.
- War in the Spirit against habits, lies, and desires.
- Deliverance dethrones; discipline seals.
- Invite the Holy Spirit to reign—not just visit.
