


Giving Information





Main point: The persistent spiritual conflict within the life of the Christian is overcome by the certainty of their victory in Jesus Christ.

Digging Deeper THE CONFLICT WITHIN Romans 7:14-15

- Does Romans 7 help you to understand the ever-present conflict between the two natures of the Christian? If so, how would you describe this conflict in your own words?
- How do you feel when sin seems to be gaining the upper hand in your life? How does that compare with what you know Scripture to be telling you?
- Why is "grace" a more powerful antidote to sin than "guilt"?
- Why do you think that God did not "replace" our old sinful nature when He gave us a new nature? In other words, why did He not fully sanctify us at the time we trusted Christ for salvation?
- It can be difficult to chart our progress in sanctification in the short-term. Looking back over the past year, what evidences of your spiritual maturation come to mind?
- In the first of his "95 Theses," the Reformer Martin Luther insisted that "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Mt 4:17), He willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." What do you think he meant by that statement?
- Why is it necessary to read Romans 8:1-2 within the context of Romans 7:14-25?
