

For further reflection:

1) Why do you think people often demand more proof from God even after hearing or seeing enough to believe? Jesus calls the generation "evil and adulterous" for asking for a sign. What does that reveal about the heart posture behind skepticism?

2) What kinds of "signs" do people today still expect from God before they will trust Him? How does the resurrection serve as God's "final sign" to a skeptical world?

3) How does the resurrection continue to shape your confidence in God's Word and promises today? What practical ways can you "be prepared to make a defense" for the hope within them (1 Peter 3:15) without becoming defensive or arrogant toward skeptics?
