


across the Middle East and North Africa so workers can thrive and remain on the field. Additionally, the wife is involved in counseling women in several countries.

God Wants to be Known Psalm 19:7-14 (page 538) March. 17, 2024 Pastor Dave Shive

I. God created a universe because he wanted to be known – 19:1-6 [Last week] Today: II. God spoke his law because he wanted to be known – 19: 7-9 -- David is correcting the belief that Shamash was the lawgiver. -- God's law is the completeness of his truth for all people III. A response is necessary when God speaks – 19:10-14 -- We respond by highly valuing God's words (v. 10-11) -- We respond with sensitivity to unintentional sin (v. 12) -- We respond by admitting to our sins of arrogance (v. 13) -- We respond with a humble desire that our thoughts and words please God (v. 14)

Questions for further reflection and discussion

- > Read through Psalm 19 each day for the next week. One reading takes less than 2 minutes.
- > Notice the three parts to the psalm (as presented in the outline). Does the flow of the psalm make sense?
- > Have you noticed the linkage between the focus on the sun (Shamash, the sun god) in v. 4-6 and the role of Shamash as perceived lawgiver in v. 7-9?
- > Can you link v. 1-6 with v. 7-9 through God's passion to communicate? What is the connection?
- > Verses 10-14 focus on a response to the Creator God and the Lawgiver God. What is the appropriate response described in v. 10-11?
- > In v. 12-13 the psalmist indicates that God's law makes him sensitive to both unintentional and intentional sin. Why does he distinguish these two types of sin?
- > In v. 14 David expresses his humble desire that he properly respond to God's word in his thoughts and words. What is that proper response? Is that response your priority?
