How to Improve your Hearing:

• Be ready and eager to hear God

(Jesus) "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" (Luke 8:8)

- o Plan ahead
- o Get enough sleep the night before
- It is OUR responsibility
- Don't come into church rushing and late
- Be prepared and prayed-up, ready to hear so it doesn't take 15 minutes for your mind to join your body.
- Deal with attitudes that prevent hearing God
 - A closed mind

- A distracted mind—watch out for your phone.
- Confess any sin in your life.

- Act on what you hear


James 1:22 "But prove yourselves doers of the word, and not just hearers who deceive themselves."

Benefits of Memorizing Scripture

a. It helps me resist temptation.

b. It helps me make wise decisions.

Psalm 119:105 "Your Word is a lamp to guide me and a light for my path."

c. It strengthens me when I'm under stress.

Psalm 119:49 "...Your promises to me are my hope. They give me strength in all my troubles; how they refresh and revive me!"

d. It comforts me when I'm sad.

Jeremiah 15:16 "Your words are what sustain me . . . They bring joy to my sorrowing heart and delight me."

e. It helps me witness to unbelievers.

1 Peter 3:15 "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have."

Why Meditate on Scripture?

1. It is the key to <u>becoming</u> like Christ.

"...Your life is shaped by your thoughts." Proverbs 4:23

"...Be transformed by the **renewing** of your mind." Romans 12:2

"As we...**contemplate** the Lord's glory, we are being transformed into His likeness..." 2 Corinthians 3:18

2. It is the key to <u>successful</u> living.

"...<u>Meditate</u> on (the Word) day and night, <u>so you may be careful to do</u> everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." Josh 1:8

Three Ways to Meditate on a Verse

- **1. Pronounce it!** Say the verse aloud, each time emphasizing a word/phrase. John 15:7
- **2. Paraphrase it!** Rewrite the verse in your own words. Philippians 4:6-7
- **3. Pray it!** Turn the verse into a prayer and say it back to God. Ephesians 2:8-9
