Worship Notes

Today is Reformation Sunday.

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther is believed to have posted his Ninety-five Theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Reformation Sunday commemorates this significant day, traditionally identified as the beginning of the Protestant Reformation.

The liturgical color for Reformation Sunday is Red.Red symbolizes the fire of the Holy Spirit that inspired the reformers, the blood of martyrs for the faith, and the power and strength of the Reformation.

Reformation Sunday

The five solas of the Reformation, include sola scriptura (Scripture alone), solus Christus (Christ alone), sola fide (faith alone), sola gratia (grace alone), and soli Deo gloria (glory to God alone).

The five solas capture the gospel of Jesus Christ. Although the phrase "five solas" may be more recent in its usage, the concepts are rooted in the 16th century Reformation. These five solas were taught by Reformers like Martin Luther and John Calvin.

It is a celebration of the gospel itself. The reformers were willing to lay their lives down for these solas.

Therefore, on the authority of God's Word alone, Amelia Plantation Chapel believe's that we are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone to the glory of God alone. Together, these truths form the foundation of and the guardrails for God's household of faith. We will guard the Gospel and hold forth the Word of Life to all (Philippians 2:16).
