Advent

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent.

Advent is a season observed in many Western Christian churches as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. Advent is also the beginning of the church year. Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, which is the Sunday nearest November 30, and ends on Christmas Eve (Dec 24). If Christmas Eve is a Sunday, it is counted as the fourth Sunday of Advent, with Christmas Eve proper beginning at sundown.

The color for the season of Advent is blue. Symbolizing royalty, this color has a long tradition in the history of the Church. Reflecting the seasonal images of hope and anticipation, and relating to Mary, the mother of our Lord, blue is once more being usedby many churches. Others continue to use purple, but because of its strongly penitential themes, themes that are more characteristic of Lent, the use of blue is most appropriate for conveying the celebratory nature of the Advent season.

New Paraments

This Advent season, our sanctuary is adorned with beautiful new blue paraments—made especially for our church! These new paraments, lovingly designed and crafted by a talented artist, will help us enter this sacred season with fresh beauty and meaning.

Traditionally, the color blue is used during Advent to symbolize hope, expectation, and the dawning light of Christ's coming. It reminds us of the night sky before the sunrise—a symbol of anticipation as we await the birth of Jesus, the Light of the World. The new blue paraments will visually mark this time of hopeful waiting and will help prepare our hearts for the joy of Christmas.

Each piece was created specifically for our sanctuary, reflecting both our church's identity and the spirit of the Advent season. Their beauty will enhance our Advent worship and focus our hearts on the promise of Christ's coming.

As we gather for worship this Advent, may these new paraments remind us of the hope we share and the light that is already breaking into our world.
