

## **Main Ideas from Daniel 12**

### **1. God's Final Judgment Is Certain and Inescapable**

Daniel 12 reminds us that every person will one day stand before God. All people will be raised, and there will be two eternal outcomes: everlasting life or everlasting shame and contempt. God's judgment will be public, righteous, and unavoidable. This passage should move us to examine whether we are truly in Christ and should also motivate us to lovingly warn others about the reality of coming judgment.

### **2. Believers Are Called to Faithful Endurance Rather Than Date-Setting**

Much of Daniel 12 contains difficult details about timing and future events, but the primary focus is not on figuring out exact dates. Instead, the chapter calls believers to remain faithful, wise, and prepared. God does not reveal everything with complete clarity, and that is intentional. Rather than obsessing over timelines, believers are called to trust God, persevere through difficulty, and live in readiness for Christ's return.

1. What stands out to you most in Daniel 12?
2. Why do you think people are often uncomfortable talking about judgment?
3. What does it mean that some will rise to everlasting life while others rise to everlasting shame?
4. Why is it important to remember that God sees even the "secret" parts of our lives?
5. What are some ways people try to hide sin from others? Why does that ultimately fail before God?
6. How does the gospel change the way Christians think about judgment?
7. What does it mean that Christ took our judgment upon Himself at the cross?
8. Why is it loving—not hateful—to warn people about coming judgment?
9. Why do you think people become so focused on trying to predict the end times?
10. How can focusing too much on timelines distract us from the real point of the passage?
11. What do you think it looks like to live in readiness for Christ's return?
12. How should the reality of eternity affect our priorities, relationships, and decisions?

13. If you truly believed Christ could return at any time, what would change about your life?
