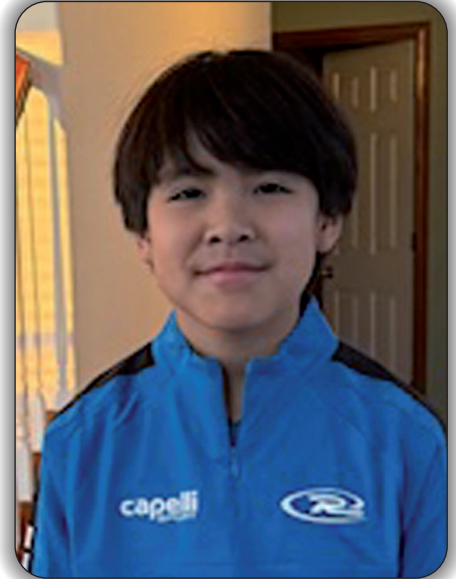
God wants us to speak with kind words and treat people well. He cares about our heart and He cares how we speak to other people. Kind words encourage people and can point them to God.

Wisdom More Precious Than Jewels

The Tuesday Tribe ended our school year studying the book of Revelation and the promise of the New Jerusalem—a radiant city adorned with precious stones and filled with the glory of God. Each child created a unique “stone,” but together they became something greater: a picture of the Church, the people of God, and the beautiful city God is preparing for His people.

In creating this piece, Tuesday Tribe artists learned that wisdom is knowing what is right and then choosing to do it God’s way. Through the story of King Solomon and the book of Proverbs, we discovered that God says wisdom is more precious than jewels because it helps us follow Him, love others well, and make good choices every day.

As we painted our gemstones, we practiced mixing colors to create shades and tones, learning how artists use light and dark colors to make gems appear bright, shiny, and full of depth. Just as gemstones reflect light, wisdom reflects God’s truth in our lives.

The arrangement of the stones also reflects the shape of our church logo, reminding us that believers are “living stones” being built together in Christ. Every gemstone is different, yet each one has a place and purpose in the larger design — just as every child is uniquely created and deeply valuable in God’s kingdom.
