

## Daniel 7

### Main Points

- God is sovereign over history and nations—no kingdom rises or falls outside His control, and nothing that happens in the world is a surprise to Him.
- He is not a distant ruler but an active and eternal King whose kingdom will outlast every human power and ultimately be shared with His people through the Son of Man.

### Questions

- What patterns do you notice about how worldly power functions according to this chapter?
- The vision shifts from chaos on earth to calm authority in heaven. What does that contrast teach us about God's rule?
- How does the image of God as the "Ancient of Days" shape the way we think about His authority over time and history?
- Why do you think God's eternal kingdom is given to a human figure rather than another beast?
- How might Daniel 7 help believers make sense of persecution or hardship?
- In what ways do earthly rulers seek to preserve their power?
- How is God's kingship different from the way governments operate today?
- What fears or uncertainties in today's world make Daniel 7 especially relevant?
