and elders, or if you would like it published in the weekly prayer guide.


⇒ If there has been no changes and you come regularly, you may just write your names and children's names on the connection card.

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT



Paul and Jean Sywulka have been ministering in Guatemala for more than 50 years. They serve at the Central American Theological Seminary--known by its Spanish acronym, SETECA. While they are located in Guatemala City, they have an international outreach with graduates in over 30 countries on all the continents. They are helping to train over 1,000 Spanish-speaking students from 20 countries to effectively teach God's Word and contribute to the

growth of His Church. Paul teaches and mentors students and Jean coordinates the hosting of visiting teachers and mission teams.

Paul and Jean recently shared in an update about how online services are continuing to play an important role in the life of the church in Guatemala. In an effort to make them more effective in the area of music, seminary music teachers have created online classes for music production. Worship leaders will have the opportunity to study three evenings a week, covering areas like selection and management of recording equipment, acoustic settings, and song writing. The SETECA ladies' organization for which Jean serves as advisor, has faithfully continued with their monthly meetings on Zoom. Paul has 12

students this trimester in a Master's class on First Peter; they are located in various places in Guatemala and one is in Mexico.

Please pray for Paul and Jean's ministry in Guatemala and for continued creativity in ministry.
