Apostles Creed:

Prayer of Confession:

Scripture Reading: Psm. 118:1-4

Scripture Reading: Exd. 15:1-18

Why do you think God's people are called to pause and praise at this moment, and how does remembering God's saving acts shape faith when the journey ahead is still uncertain?

Scripture Reading: Col. 3:12-17

Which of these qualities do you find hardest to "put on" in everyday relationships, and how does letting the peace of Christ rule in our hearts change the way a community lives together?
