Opening Prayer:

Apostles Creed:

Scripture Reading: Ezk. 33:10-16

Scripture Reading: Rev. 11:15-19

The Lord has given the kingdom to the Messiah and He shall reign. How should that truth shape the way we live, worship, and respond to the world today—especially when it still seems like other powers are in control?
