Opening Prayer:

Apostles Creed:

Prayer of Confession:

Scripture Reading: Psm. 116

Scripture Reading: Jonah 2:1-10

What does this prayer teach us about repentance, gratitude, and God's mercy, and how might it shape the way we pray when we find ourselves facing the consequences of our own disobedience or failure?

Scripture Reading: Mat. 12:38-42

What does this passage reveal about the danger of seeking proof without faith, and how does it challenge us to examine how we respond to the truth and grace already given to us in Christ?

Lord's Prayer

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
