What does this passage teach us about the difference between fear-based faith and trust in God—and where do you see yourself in the story when you face situations that feel impossible?

Scripture Reading: Col. 3:5-11

What do you find most challenging about letting go of the “old self,” and how does remembering who you already are in Christ shape the way real change happens?
